SMALL BUSINESS COMPLIANCE GUIDE Amendment to Subtitle 02 Fisheries Service Regarding the Department's Regulations for Commercial Reporting – Snakehead and Catfish Licenses COMAR 08.02.13.06 Released July 28, 2023 Updated October 20, 2023 Updated December 15, 2023

This Guide is prepared in accordance with the requirements of State Government Article, §10-110, Annotated Code of Maryland. It is intended to help small businesses comply with the revised rules adopted in the above-referenced sections of the Code of Maryland Regulations. This Guide is not intended to replace or supersede these rules, but to facilitate compliance with the rules. Although we have attempted to cover all parts of the rules that might be especially important to small businesses, the coverage may not be exhaustive. This Guide cannot anticipate all situations in which the rules apply.

I. SUMMARY & FAQs

What has been proposed?

The Department proposed modifying its reporting regulations to require individuals who have the Northern Snakehead License and the Blue and Flathead Catfish Finfish Trotline License to submit monthly reports, similar to the rest of the commercial licensees who harvest finfish from Maryland's tidal waters. These are relatively new commercial licenses created by the General Assembly that were not included when the reporting regulations were first written because these licenses did not exist at that time.

Why is this change necessary?

The Department generally requires commercial licensees to submit monthly harvest reports to account for any activity taken under the authorization of that license. Currently, all finfish harvesters with the exception of Northern Snakehead License and Blue and Flathead Catfish Finfish Trotline License holders are required to submit the Commercial Finfish Log on a monthly basis. By adding these two license types to the Department's reporting regulation, all commercial finfish harvesters will be required to submit the same type of information. Commercial harvest reports are an important source of abundance data. Both the harvest information and the effort information (amount of work it took to land the harvest) are important indicators and assist in the Department's management of the State's fish resources.

Who will this affect?

Commercial licensees who are licensed under Natural Resources Article, §§4-701.1 and 4-701.2, Annotated Code of Maryland (Northern Snakehead License and Blue and Flathead Catfish Finfish Trotline License, respectively).

Has this change been discussed with stakeholders?

This idea was scoped with the Sport Fisheries Advisory Commission and Tidal Fisheries Advisory Commission at their July 2023 meetings.

What is the specific regulatory action?

Amend Regulation .06 under COMAR 08.02.13 Fishing Licenses—Point Assignment, License Revocation and Suspension Schedule and Criteria, and Hearing Procedure.

II. RECORDKEEPING AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

This action creates new recordkeeping and reporting requirements for holders of Northern Snakehead Licenses and Blue and Flathead Catfish Finfish Trotline Licenses. Those licensees will have to submit monthly reports on forms provided by the Department. The monthly report will be due on the 10^{th} of the subsequent month – i.e., the report for the month of May is due to the Department by June 10. The report is the Daily Commercial Fisheries Catch Log, available on the Department's website (form <u>here</u>, additional instructions <u>here</u>). The Department also annually mails a copy of that log, along with mailing labels for each month, to each license holder.

III. IMPLEMENTATION DATE

This regulation change is effective December 25, 2023.
