(Minimum delivery 25 trees.) Please arrange your delivery directly with Shemin Nurseries 301-421-1220 after receiving your order confirmation from us.

If you wish to be included in an early, outlying delivery, please place your order by APRIL 5TH. A single delivery at no additional charge will be made early in the season to DNR sites to assist your pick-up in outlying regions; Washington County (Greenbrier SP), Queen Anne's County (Tuckahoe SP) & Southern Prince George's County (Cedarville State Forest). All plants must be picked up by May 19th. **NOTE:** Be sure to count your trees & shrubs at Shemin BEFORE you leave the grounds. Shortages discovered later will NOT be replaced.)

Please bring your confirmation with you to pick up your order.

This is **NOT** a program for planting on PRIVATE PROPERTY. All trees must be planted on public land including parks, community open spaces, rights-of-ways, government facilities, and school grounds.

TREE-MENDOUS MARYLAND, a program of the Maryland Forest Service, remains one of our most popular programs aimed at helping citizens restore tree cover on public land and community open space in Maryland. To date, we have assisted more than 3,000 towns and communities, parks, and schools planting trees and shrubs to help clean the water, clean the air, and keep our towns and cities inviting, livable, and environmentally viable places to live.

Consider the following species for your spring planting:

★ **Red flowering dogwood 'Cherokee Chief'** – (*Cornus florida*) a cultivar that is noted for its large, deep rose red flowers. Long-lasting crimson fall foliage and ample berries for wildlife that remain after leaves have fallen. Medium growth rate reaching approximately 20'. Excellent understory tree or specimen. Prefers part shade and moist but well-drained soil. Do not plant in heavy, wet soils.

★ **Fringe tree** (*Chionanthus virginicus*) great for woodland or understory, easy to grow, beautiful spreading small (12' to 20') native multi-stem shrub. Can be trained to grow as single stem small tree. Prefers sun and medium moisture, but tolerates shade and adapts to a variety of soil conditions. Covered with slightly fragrant, eye-catching fringy white blooms after dogwoods fade in May. Medium-dark green lustrous leaves turn bright yellow in fall. Excellent for wildlife.

★ **Black tupelo** (*Nyssa sylvatica*) This beautiful native shade tree (30-50 feet high) has a pyramidal shape, slow/medium growth rate and is a good choice for naturalized settings or along residential streets. Its leaves are glossy dark green turning a spectacular bright yellow, orange or scarlet/purple in fall. Blue-black fruit provides food for wildlife. Requires a sunny or semi-shade site with deep, well-drained acidic soil. Spring transplant is preferred; prune in the fall. No serious diseases or insect pests; tolerates coastal conditions. Sensitive to soil compaction and heavy pollution.
