

THE MARYLAND WILDLIFE ADVISORY COMMISSION  
MINUTES – FEBRUARY 20, 2013

Chairman Jeffrey Plummer called the meeting to order at 9:40 a.m.

**Introduction: New Member**

- Director Peditto welcomed Ms. Beth Wojton as a new member of the Wildlife Advisory Commission.
- Commissioner Wojton works at the Maryland Environmental Service, which is an independent State agency. The Maryland Environmental Service manages water, waste water, and numerous environmental projects for the State of Maryland, private sector, counties, and municipalities. Commissioner Wojton has been hunting for about five years but said she would have started sooner. Commissioner Wojton concluded that she is looking forward to serving and participating on the Commission.

**Wildlife Advisory Commission Meeting Packets – Group Discussion**

- Chairman Plummer suggested that the Commission should consider getting the WAC packets electronically instead of being mailed. It is an added expense to the Wildlife and Heritage Service budget.
  1. Commissioner Fratz indicated at times he has difficulty with getting the electronic format of the WAC packets. Commissioner Fratz added to ensure that he gets the information; Commissioner Fratz prefers to have the meeting packets mailed.
  2. Commissioner Rodney expressed that he likes getting a hard copy of the WAC packets.
  3. Chairman Plummer stated that he prefers to get the WAC packets electronically.
  4. The Commission decided to continue receiving the WAC packets by mail.

**Approval for the February 20, 2013 Meeting Agenda**

- The February 20, 2013 Wildlife Advisory Commission Meeting Agenda was presented to the Commission.
- Motion:
  1. Commissioner Compton motioned to accept the February 20, 2013 Meeting Agenda as presented.
  2. Commissioner Gregor seconded.
  3. All in favor. Motion passed.

**Approval for Minutes from November 14, 2012 Meeting**

- The November 14<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes were distributed to the Commission prior to the meeting.
- Motion:
  1. Commissioner Bonomo motioned to approve the November 14<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes as presented.
  2. Commissioner Boyles Griffin seconded.
  3. All in favor. Motion passed.

**2013 Legislative Session Update** – Presentation given by Glenn Therres, Associate Director and Paul A. Peditto, Director

- Associate Director Therres provided the Commission a list of bills that the Wildlife and Heritage Service is following. [ATTACHMENT A] The summary is set-up with the bill number in the first column, second column is the general topic of the bill, third column is the delegate or senator or delegation that introduced the bill, and fourth column is the status of the bill (as of the date that

the summary was printed).

- These bills are wildlife-related or otherwise affect the Wildlife and Heritage Service. There are additional bills that the Department of Natural Resources is monitoring.
- Associate Director Therres outlined the other wildlife related bills.
  1. Any bill that is not withdrawn is still being considered by the Environmental Matters or the Education, Health, and Environmental Matters.
  2. Several of the bills are cross-filed with either a House Bill or Senate Bill, which will expedite the process.
  3. HB0276 Frederick County – Deer Hunting – Use of Rifles – This is to expand the rifle zone for deer hunting within Frederick County to the entire Frederick County. This is the first legislative attempt to say where you hunt with a rifle. This is currently done by the regulation process. This bill was withdrawn.
  4. HB0365 – Harford County – Archery Hunting – Safety Zone – At this time the safety zone is 150 yards from occupied structure or dwelling for any weapon, which is the default safety zone in Maryland. Frederick County first, and then Carroll County reduced the safety zone to 50 yards for archery hunting only in their counties. HB0365 is similar but the reduction of the safety zone for archery hunting to 100 yards in Harford County, which is different than the other two counties that have the reduction in safety zone as 50 yards for archery hunting only.
  5. HB0366 – Archery Hunting – Safety Zone - This bill would reduce the safety zone Statewide for archery hunting only.
  6. HB0367 – Hunting – Deer Firearms Season – January Days – This bill, along with HB0369 Hunting – Deer Muzzle Loader Season – January Days, would take away the Department’s regulatory authority to manage deer with firearms, muzzleloader, and bow, which traditionally is done by regulations. These bills would set those dates by law.
  7. HB0368 – Bow Hunting – Possession of Handguns for Protection – This bill would allow a hunter that is hunting in Garrett and Allegany Counties to carry a handgun while archery hunting to defend against bears attacks.
  8. HB0505 – Natural Resources – Hunting and Fishing Licenses Applications’ - Social Security Number – The law will exempt the Department of Natural Resources from requiring the Social Security number. For an agency not to be in compliance would cost that agency lost federal funds - millions of dollars.
  9. HB0543 – Carroll County – Deer Hunting – This bill gives the Department the regulatory authority to establish Sunday deer hunting in Carroll County from October 1<sup>st</sup> through the second Sunday in January.
  10. HB0671 – Montgomery County – Archery Hunting – Safety Zone MC 2-13 – This is a local bill to adopt the 50 yards safety zone for archery hunting only in Montgomery County.
  11. HB0708 – Natural Resources – Nuisance Organisms – Penalties – This is an aquatic bill that set fines for license sale and distribution of invasive aquatic species in Maryland.
  12. HB0812 – Hunting – Certificate of Competency and safety Veterans and Active Duty Military – This bill would exempt veterans and active duty military from needing to take the field component of hunter safety. Veterans and active duty military would still have to take the classroom or online component of hunter safety and passed the test.
  13. HB990 – Garrett County – Deer Hunting – Three-Point Rule – This bill would change the definition of antlered deer in Garrett County to a deer with minimum of three points on at least one of its two antlers.
  14. HB0936 – Natural Resources – Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup - This bill would establish a onetime workgroup to evaluate and develop recommendations for the General

Assembly and the Governor on the conservation of State's plants - particularly rare plants and resources. This bill, if it passes, would require the Department's staff to lead the workgroup and develop the report by the deadline, end of 2013 calendar.

15. SB0619 Wildlife Management and Sustainability Act of 2013 – This bill would provide fee increase on hunting licenses. The Maryland Sportsmen's Foundation along with some stakeholders' organizations revamped this bill from last year's version. The Department was technical consultant for SB0619. Director Peditto gave credit to the groups and individuals that were involved, especially MLSF, WAC, MBS, Western MD Sportsmen's Coalition, MD Waterfowler's, Maryland Guides and Outfitters Association, HSUS, Commissioner Compton, Commissioner Rodney, Commissioner Boyles-Griffin, Chairman Plummer, and the organizations that they lead and serve. This bill raises the resident license fee from \$24.50 to \$37.00, nonresident license fee from \$130.00 to \$150.00, and three-day nonresident license fee from \$45.00 to \$65.00. This bill also waives junior hunters from purchasing stamps. It adds the requirement of non-hunters or individuals who do not possess a hunting license shall pay a fee when they use Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs). This bill also gives the Department the authority to establish that fee. This component has been discussed by the Commission since 2003. Director Peditto added that the resident hunting license fee has been \$24.50 since 1989.
  16. SB0754 Hunting – Schools – Expanded Safety Zone – This bill would expand the safety zone to 500 yards around all public and non-public schools. This bill does not define schools. At this point it could be any type of school.
  17. SB0932 Criminal Law- Deadly Weapons on the Property of an Institution of Higher Education – This bill would restrict any deadly weapon on the property of institution of higher education and colleges. There are some exemptions, such as law enforcement, but it does not exempt wildlife control operators and the Department, which do wildlife damage control.
- Questions and Answers:
    1. Commissioner Boyles Griffin asked what the intent behind HB0365 and HB0366 was. Commissioner Boyles Griffin informed the Commission that several of her constituents are concerned about these changes because they do not want hunters that close to their homes.
      - a. Director Peditto has been communicating with the sponsors on these two bills to try to sort this out. The hearings for these bills were scheduled for February 20<sup>th</sup>. Director Peditto informed the sponsors that the Department would prefer HB0365 with an amendment to make it consistent with Frederick and Carroll Counties. This means each of these counties will have a safety zone of 50 yards for archery hunting only. The amendment would avoid law enforcement and public communication confusion.
    2. Commissioner Boyles Griffin added that her constituents would probably not mind as much if the safety zone was 50 yards from the property line.
      - a. Director Peditto responded that there is nothing in the Department's safety law and the proposed bills that speak of property line. This is something that the Department would not support because a person cannot identify property line, but a person can identify distance from an occupied structure or dwelling.
      - b. Director Peditto added final comments, which are that most hunters are closer than 150 yards because they have permission from landowners to be closer. The 50 yards reduction just reduces the number of people the hunters have to ask for permission.
    3. Chairman Plummer commented on HB0367 and HB0369 that legislatures are getting in dangerous territory when the legislatures take away the authority from the Department that has the specialists.

- a. Director Peditto acknowledged the Chair's comments and highlighted that the only two seasons that are governed by legislature are muskrat and mink.
4. Commissioner Compton noticed that HB0584 Bow Hunting – Possession of Handguns for Protection, which is sponsored by Allegany County Delegation, is a duplication of HB0204 Bow Hunting – Possession of Handguns for Protection.
5. Commissioner Compton asked about the bills that were introduced by Delegate Glass that take away the regulatory authority from the Department to set these seasons - would it be a benefit that the Commission's vote in opposition of these bills and Director Peditto could communicate that to the Environmental Matters Committee.
  - a. The Commission decided to wait to learn more before sending communication on these bills.
  - b. Commissioner Boyles Griffin added it may be that the Commission should have something drafted on stand-by just in case the Commission does not meet in time.
  - c. The Maryland Farm Bureau (MFB) is supporting the muzzleloader and the bow bills. The other bills the MFB has no position on.
6. Commissioner Fratz asked how many encounters have been reported between hunters and bears to suggest that these bills, such as HB0368, HB0584, and SB0204 are necessary.
  - a. Commissioner Gregor mentioned that her husband and daughter were in a tree and a bear climbed up that same tree and her husband was able to get the bear to leave; this occurred in Allegany County. There was another occasion where a bear poked its head in the ground blind, the bear went away. Commissioner Gregor expressed that her family was fortunate that no one was harmed.
  - b. Director Peditto pointed out that our staff's recommendation to hunters is to carry pepper spray and/or air-horns in bear territory.
7. Commissioner Compton asked what the Department's position on HB0812 is.
  - a. Director Peditto commented that the Department has not developed a position on HB0812.
  - b. Director Peditto informed the Commission that the way that HB0812 is drafted it is unclear as to whether or not the bill exempts veterans and active duty military from being in attendance on the third day of hunter safety, because the bill reads that veterans and active military duty are exempt from the field day requirements. It does not say that they are exempt from the written exam, which is a component of the online protocols. It may mean that a person still needs to pass the written exam, which is done normally on the third day or scheduled Saturday.
8. Commissioner Fratz asked what the Department's position on HB990 is.
  - a. Director Peditto indicated the Department is opposed to HB990 because it codifies the antler restriction in law. Director Peditto explained that the Department is not opposed to the idea – but we would prefer to manage it through the regulatory process and our stakeholder system of deliberation.
9. Commissioner Fratz asked how the Department would manage the non-consumptive user permit.
  - a. Director Peditto mentioned that most likely it would be an electronic system where a person purchases the 'stamp' online and keeps a copy of the receipt with them and a copy on their vehicle. This permit will be for WMAs only. Now, keep in mind that a hunter that possesses a hunting license is exempt from this permit.
10. Chairman Plummer asked Captain Ingerson about the NRP monitoring of WMAs during the non-hunting season.
  - a. Captain Ingerson replied that NRP are aware of illegal ATV riding during that time but NRP presence on WMAs is reduced during non-hunting season. With this additional

- requirement for non-consumptive users, NRP will have to increase its presence on WMAs.
11. Commissioner Wojton asked about the occurrence of the failure of last year's fee bill.
    - a. Director Peditto indicated the bill passed the House committee but failed on the House floor by seven votes.
  12. Commissioner Wojton asked who the groups that participated in the process were.
    - a. Director Peditto recalled that the Western Maryland Coalition of Sportsmen's Groups, (five counties: Garrett, Allegany, Washington, Frederick, and Carroll), each of these counties have their own council, it includes literally tens of thousands of members within the hunt clubs in those counties. Each county had a representative and a vote. The Maryland Bowhunters Society, the Maryland Waterfowl Association, the Maryland Guide and Outfitters Association, the Maryland Legislative Sportsmen's Foundation (lead the process), and smaller subsets, such as the Southern Chapter of Waterfowlers, and Quality Deer Management. SB 619 is not a Departmental bill.
  13. Commissioner Boyles Griffin asked how SB 0932 defines a deadly weapon.
    - a. Associate Director Therres commented that SB0932 does not define what constitutes a deadly weapon.
- The Commission can review natural resources related bills by going to <http://mgaleg.maryland.gov/webmga/frmlst.aspx?tab=home>, then click on By Broad Subject, where you can select Natural Resources (M1) or Hunting and Fishing (M2); this will provide the list of all bills under the Department's jurisdiction or hunting and fishing section.

#### **Select July Meeting Date – Group Discussion**

- Chairman Plummer indicated that the Commission waits to discuss the Migratory Game Bird seasons and bag limits. The Game Bird Section meets with the Atlantic Flyway Council (AFC), so the presentation has to take place later than the normal meeting date of the third Wednesday of the month. The proposed date is July 24<sup>th</sup>.
- The Commission agreed that the July meeting will be held on July 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Break – (Ten Minutes)**

#### **WAC's Operating Guidelines – Chairman Plummer**

- The Operating Guidelines were inserted in the November 14, 2012 WAC Meeting Minutes packet.
- Chairman Plummer outlined to the Commission the Operating Guidelines.

#### **2013 Working Agenda – WAC Review and Approval – Group Discussion**

- The proposed 2013 Work Chart was put in the November 14, 2012 WAC Meeting Minutes Packet.
- Chairman Plummer pointed out that if a member of the Commission has an agenda topic, please inform Ms. Spencer so she can get it added to the agenda.
- Chairman Plummer informed the Commission that it is time to think about nominees for the Conservationist of the Year, Employee of the Year, and Farmer of the Year.
  1. Submit your nominees to Ms. Spencer.
  2. The Maryland Farm Bureau provides the nominees for the Farmer of the Year.
  3. The Conservationist of the Year and Employee of the Year nominees can come from the Commission, members of the public, and employee(s).
  4. Ms. Spencer provides a synopsis of the nominees and the Commission reviews the nominees' letters and support letters. After that the Commission votes on each category.
- Commissioner Bonomo requested at the March meeting to have an update on the State Wildlife

Action Plan and an update on the Natural Gas Development and Fracking issue.

- Commissioner Compton suggested that the Commission add to the agenda the Proposed DNR Legislative and Regulatory Concepts to the November 20<sup>th</sup> meeting.
  1. Director Peditto explained that most of the Department's concepts at that time are just that. There may be things that Director Peditto may not be able to discuss at that time; for example, a new idea that would require input from different units. That discussion may have to be closed to the public.
  2. Director Peditto indicated if the Commission developed concepts that the Commission wants the Department to consider that is scheduled for the June 19<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- Commissioner Rodney motioned to approve the 2013 Work Chart.
  1. Commissioner Boyles Griffin seconded.
  2. Motion carried.

**Maryland Farm Bureau Update** – Presentation given by Matt Tefffeu, Assistant Director of Government Relations

- The Maryland Farm Bureau is in support of the Sunday hunting bills.
- The Doe Harvest Challenge will take place again this year. MFB met with the Farmers and Hunters Feeding the Hungry (FHFH). The FHFH is going to revamp the program.

**Natural Resources Police (NRP) Update** – Presentation given by Captain Lloyd Ingerson.

- Captain Ingerson handed out the 2012 Maryland Natural Resources Police Statistics Report for hunting related incidents [**ATTACHMENT B**] that were reported to the NRP Communication Center. This report does not include citations and warnings. The Commission will receive that information later on this year.
- Questions and Answers:
  1. Chairman Plummer asked under the hunting waterfowl related to the safety zone violation was this typically hunting too close to occupied dwelling.
    - a. Captain Ingerson explained that most of time it is related to that but not all the time. It also includes hunters hunting at blindsites; a lot of this is offshore waterfowl hunting related. Often enough the calls are unfounded, but it is necessary for NRP to respond to these calls. NRP has seen an increase in the last five years of calls related to safety zones for waterfowl hunting.
  2. Commissioner Compton asked how often NRP receives call from the Catch-a-Poacher hotline since the sheet indicates six incidents – was this six calls to the Catch a Poacher Hotline or was this six incidents that resulted from the calls to the hotline number.
    - a. Captain Ingerson pointed out that number is six calls to the Catch a Poacher Hotline.
    - b. Captain Ingerson acknowledged that something needs to be done to reenergize the Catch a Poacher Initiative.
    - c. Commissioner Compton mentioned that it may take up to three days for an officer to respond after someone reports something through the Catch a Poacher Hotline. Commissioner Compton indicated that the Department needs to be more responsive to these tips from the Catch a Poacher Hotline.
    - d. Commissioner Compton reiterated his comments from previous meetings that the focus should be conservation enforcement and ensuring that NRP is staying focused on conservation enforcement.
    - e. Captain Ingerson agreed with Commissioner Compton that the number of calls is low. There has never been significant funding to promote an award for individuals that report

- poachers.
3. Commissioner Compton asked if there is a mechanism already in place that could address the lack of callers reporting poachers.
    - a. Captain Ingerson outlined that there may be some things the NRP may be able implement to reduce the response time.
    - b. Captain Ingerson suggested that the Catch a Poacher Hotline information should be placed in the hunting guide where hunters can locate it easier.
    - c. Chairman Plummer suggested that the Catch a Poacher Hotline number needs to be added to the hunting license, so that hunters do not have to look for it. Commissioner Gregor agreed with Chairman Plummer because the hunters have their hunting licenses on them, so having it on the license is a great idea.
    - d. Director Peditto agreed to discuss this with the staff who manage COMPASS and our license system.
  4. Chairman Plummer requested an update on NRP staffing.
    - a. Captain Ingerson highlighted that recently a group of graduates will be completing their field training in March. These graduates have been out in the field with their training officers since January.
    - b. Captain Ingerson mentioned there have been more retirements. It is going to be difficult in the next five years to keep pace unless NRP decides to do something different in recruitment.
    - c. NRP is in the process of doing background checks on individuals that will be starting the Academy. NRP are looking at around 15 to 20 individuals for the next Academy.

**Old Business** – no report.

**New Business**

- Commissioner Compton asked about the Governor's email to the licensed hunters through the COMPASS system.
  1. Director Peditto mentioned that the Governor sent an email through COMPASS to those hunters that provided their email address to the COMPASS system.
  2. Discussion ensued that it was an opportunity to elevate Junior Hunter opportunities. Maybe we should send messages about the Catch a Poacher Hotline, dove season is about to open, and it is time to buy a hunting license, etc.
  3. Chairman Plummer informed the Commission that there are individuals that are writing summaries of the gun bill, if a person is reading the summaries of the gun bill instead of the bill, the understanding of that bill is going to come from the summaries. Chairman Plummer emphasized that is going to be the biggest problem.
  4. Commissioner Compton drew attention, that his concern is the use of the email system. Commissioner Compton expressed that he felt it was inappropriate.
  5. Director Peditto added that WHS has the ability to use that same system to get messages out to hunters about other hunting related activities including the information about the Catch a Poacher Hotline.

**Adjournment**

- The meeting was adjourned at 12:00 P.M.
